

## **5 ESTABLISHED SCHOOL SUPPORT HUBS**

### We co-create solutions to problems that prevent

implementation of the school's strategic plans – School Development Plan (SDP – 3 years' plan) and School Improvement plan (SIP – 12 months' plan).

### SSCC has established 5 functioning Support Hubs

- The School "owns / leads" the Support Hub.
- Stakeholders are informed of the SDP & SIP priorities.
- Organisations involved in the school can align solutions to the school's plan, because they understand how they fit into the broader strategy to improve the school.

## **MAIN OBJECTIVES ACHIEVED**

By God's grace and His favour upon our organization, we were able to achieve most of our General objectives in the past year:

- 1. We have **built and improved trust relationships** with all 5 principals and some of their team members. We have also found a few champions in every school that we are working with, therefore building further on the relationships within the schools. We have built quite a lot of new network relationships and formed good partnerships this year and are looking forward to more strategic partnerships in the year to come.
- 2. The **whole-school audit**, called the **Compass Calibration Survey**, was implemented successfully and the feedback reports to all 5 schools were completed and followed up with an in-person session with the Senior Management Team of each school. It was well-received and will now be used as a baseline for their Strategic meetings and for Strong Schools for Monitoring and Evaluation and Impact Reporting.
- 3. **Five Support Hubs** were established and have now started to function more effectively. The principals shared very positive feedback regarding the impact of the Support Hubs already after one year and they all signed our Collaboration agreements.
- 4. We have **co-created quite a few solutions with every school** based on their School Improvement Plans, School Development Plans and their most urgent needs. We are thankful to the organisations, which have committed to align with SSCC and our schools to support our efforts.
- 5. Through ongoing feedback and reflection processes, feedback and thanks are given to our donors and supporters. We celebrate the successes with our team, schools and funders. Impact stories are shared in the form of video clips, interviews and photos.

## **COMPASS CALIBRATION – Whole school audit**

Dr Henk Punt and Sonja van der Bank (Camino Consulting) created this Calibration survey and Feedback Reports for the schools, with qualitative and quantative measurements.

- The objective: to create a tool to measure the basic functionality of the schools where SSCC is involved.
- The tool was developed and introduced to our five schools. The schools have completed and submitted the Google Form format.
- A report for each of the schools was written and feedback sessions were held at our schools





## **BRIGHTSTAR LIFE SKILLS WORKSHOPS**

- Life skills programs for Teachers and Learners
- We trained and now use use facilitators from our community
- BrightStar obtained a funder, TrimTab Foundation, to bless 12 schools of the Helderberg Basin with Teacher Team Building workshops this year
- Two of our schools had workshops for learners and all five schools now completed their Team Building.

## **LITERACY AND LIBRARY PROJECT**

## **ACJ PHAKADE PRIMARY SCHOOL**

Sewage and overflow drainage constantly caused flooding in the school and school grounds. The kitchen could not operate nor provide lunches for the learners.

#### The Strong Schools intervention (in brief)

- We hired a digger loader, moved earth to create better drainage and inserted drainage pipes
- Built a 200m² plinth for the container kitchens to stand on
- Collaborated with CoCT and Public Works towards a more sustainable solution from their side



## **BOREHOLE FOR NOMZAMO HIGH SCHOOL**

- The continuous shortage of water for their ablution facilities was raised at a School Support Hub.
- Afrimat Bulk Commodities became aware of this challenge and offered to assist the Nomzamo High School with water from a borehole. They funded the installation of a borehole, with all necessary pumps and plumbing and electrical plumbing alterations.
- Afrimat managed the project in collaboration with Strong Schools and made sure qualified local service providers were appointed for the project.

## **NOMZAMO CLEAN-UP AND RECYCLING PROJECT**

#### Challenge

Not enough waste bins and inadequate municipal services to service the Nomzamo community. This situation results in littering and unhygienic conditions.

#### **Vision and How**

- Educate and empower pupils, teachers and parents (and in time the surrounding community) around the Nomzamo community to reduce waste, assist with job creation and feeding children and more families.
- Set up a viable recycling collection program and a "Swap Shop".

Thanks to the initiative of the Grayswan Charitable Trust and the support of the City of Cape Town, Strong Schools collaborated and started a Clean-up and Recycling initiative in 3 of our schools in Nomzamo.

## **LESSONS LEARNED FROM THE PAST YEAR**

- 1. It takes much longer for projects where trust relationships do not yet exist and so SSCC spent quite a bit of time and effort building these trust relationships within the schools and with partners and collaborators. SSCC will therefore continue to focus on doing so when we partner with new organisations and when we are blessed to move into more schools.
- 2. The Support Hubs and Audit were both pilot projects and therefore needed a lot more time and effort than expected, before it could be implemented properly.
- 3. The challenges in the disadvantaged communities are huge and complex and the level of intervention to make a true impact needs a lot of planning, thinking and doing and many times requires re-thinking and re-doing. Most of what we try to accomplish, is part of our holistic approach, addressing mind, body and soul and therefore it takes a lot of time, effort and resources before real impact is visible.
- 4. We need to streamline and focus our outcomes and efforts on our current Theory of Change, so that we can start out-sourcing the more specialized needs, for example social services and counseling of learners and teachers that need that type of assistance.
- 5. Working with the WCED and government departments has many challenges and bureaucracy does not make it any easier to get things done in Government schools. We will have to intentionally build relationships with people in the WCED and government who are sympathetic towards our cause in their schools and can better influence the decisions being taken. It will

save a lot of time and enhance the implementation and impact of our initiatives.

## **AREAS OF DEVELOPMENT**

#### **Currently SSCS** is working on improving in the following areas:

- A more effective Funding strategy
- A more effective **Marketing strategy** to create better Public awareness of what SSCC is trying to achieve in our communities, resulting in a better buy-in from more people and businesses collaborating with us towards multiplying our impact in the Education sector
- Increasing the **number of volunteers** we have
- Increasing a solid foundation of at least **20 regular donors**
- Double our **MySchool supporters**
- Creating an effective database management system
- Finding a company to support us to get our **compass calibration tool on a virtual platform**, in order for other schools to be able to use it as a measuring and monitoring tool also. This can become an income stream for SSCC.
- Finding more effective strategies to improve Literacy and Numeracy in all the schools
